

JFK STAR PICKED AS HONORARY GRID CAPTAIN

Ursuline's Irish dominate all-Exponent

Ursuline dominates the Catholic Exponent all-diocese all-star team much as the Tom Carey team outplayed the other squads during the year.

The Irish placed four men on the offensive team and an equal number on the defense in the annual guessing game done by the Exponent with the cooperation of the varsity coaches.

In addition to Coach Carey, the selections were made from nominations submitted by Dan McGinnis, St. John, Ashtabula; Rey Dempsey, Central Catholic, Canton; Jim McQuaide, John F. Kennedy, Warren, and Denny Barrett, who leaves his Cardinal Mooney post this season.

Ursuline racked up 6-3 record in what was supposed to be an off year, following back-to-back City Series titles. Wins over Central and Mooney assured the Irish of the mythical diocese title.

Special mention and the honorary captaincy for the diocese all-star team goes to John F. Kennedy's senior halfback Perry Martini, who earned everybody's all-star honors as a sophomore and as a junior.

Despite being on the bench for four games this year due to a severe thigh injury, he led the Eagles in yardage and total points, and practically upset Brookfield single-handed. Martini, who one coach describes as a "gentleman and leader on and off the field," earned all-Exponent honors at a St. Mary sophomore and repeated last year as a member of JFK's first squad.

Martini averaged better than 600 yards a year as a sophomore and junior, and had a half-season total of 369 yards to lead the winless Eagles this year. If he had been able to play in the other four games, JFK may have had a better record than their six losses and three ties. Coach McQuaide described him as "our top running back."

The Exponent offensive unit:

Bill Dorris, son of Mr. and Mrs. Martin Dorris, 35 S. York-shire, a St. Columba product, played quarterback on offense and cornerman on defense. He carried the ball for 456 yards for better than four yards a carry. He completed 14 out of 42 passes for 152 yards, and scored 50 points. He did most of the Irish booting including 29 kicks for 1,173 yards, an average of more than 40 yards a

start until halfway through the season. In four games, he had 58 carries and 400 yards; in the final game with Perry, he clicked off 169 yards in 22 attempts. Coach Dan McGinnis said:

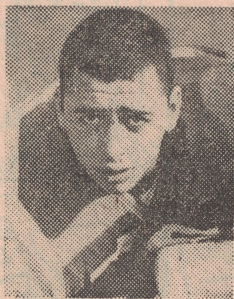
"All of a sudden this year Alan blossomed into the type of boy every coach wants to play for him. He got the chance about midway during the season and responded with at least 150 per cent effort. Even with a losing season such as we had, I have to consider the season a complete success when I see the play of Alan Urso. At no time in my coaching career have I been more satisfied and more pleased with one particular boy."

Frank Coleman, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Coleman, 2919 Medford Ave., St. Nicholas Parish, is Coach Denny Barrett's top choice. He broke the Cardinal school scoring record with 22 TDs, and ran up nearly 2,000 yards in three years. He was a selection on last year's all-Exponent squad. Barrett said:

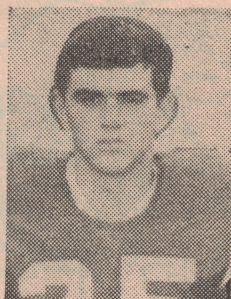
"We used him at halfback and fullback, and he runs well from both positions. He gets the yardage because he just doesn't quit when he's hit."

Joe Gilberto, son of Mrs. Joseph Gilberto, 110 Landsdown Blvd., was the Irish offensive center and linebacker on defense. Coach Carey said:

"Joe is a consistently good center. He was also used on defense. He's in the upper quarter
